We do this to honor Claire Lynsey Rubini, who passed away from a heart condition in 2000 when she was just ten years old. Our programs and services embrace her favorite activities. CREATING YOUNG READERS (2 ½ hours of training and orientation, 1 hour per week – background check required)
Creating Young Readers Preschool was started in 2006 and allows volunteers the opportunity to work with children ages 3, 4 and 5 who are at risk of falling behind in emergent literacy skills. Volunteers are required to life fingerprinted and provide references, a medical release and educational transcripts. This program includes book distribution.
Creating Young Readers Elementary School provides children in grades K-2nd grade with volunteer "Reader Friends" who work with them one-to-one to increase early literacy skills necessary to experience success in the classroom. Additionally, this program includes book distribution, parent advocacy, and information to engage parents with their children in at home reading time. Volunteers are required to pass a background check.
Real Men READ-y is a partnership between Read for Literacy, The Toledo Lucas County Public Library, United Way of Greater Toledo-African American Leadership Council and Toledo Public Schools. This program matches African American men with African American male students as MENtors. Volunteers are required to pass a background check. This program includes book distribution.
LITERACY OUTREACH & VOLUNTEERS (Training provided, in some cases, background check required)
Literacy Outreach is our opportunity to travel into the community and share our love of reading with others at health fairs, low-income housing developments and other places where children and families gather for recreation and to learn. We have distributed more than 10,000 books and family activity sheets in our outreach work and look forward to expanding the program each year.
Special Event Committee and Volunteers on Day of Events make it possible for Read for Literacy to raise fundand provide quality programs. Training is provided for event volunteers.
